

# Eliza Cooper

Eliza graduated from Newtown High School of the Performing Arts in 2015, and in 2016, she undertook Sydney Dance Company's Pre-Professional Year Program and received a Certificate IV in Dance Performance. In PPY16 Revealed, she performed works by Thomas Bradley, Kristina Chan, Zachary Lopez and Rafael Bonachela. She continued her study of dance in Israel with Kibbutz Contemporary Dance Company. Here she performed works and presented her choreographic work Stonemilker. In recent years, she performed in Nick Cave's HEARD, Kay Armstrong and Natalie Ayton's *Momentum* and in Alana Yee's S.A.M.P.L.E. She also performed in ØFFERINGS' immersive evenings HYPER-REAL and SUB-KULTURE VULTURE . Eliza

participated in choreographic residency programs with DirtyFeet, Ausdance NSW, FORM Dance Projects and Critical Path.

She performed her solo work Solitudinem in PACT Salon: Apactalyptic and Salome Dance of the Seven Veils in The Miraculous Mandarin with the Ensemble Apex orchestra. Her ensemble work DETKA was performed in The Combination's 3C Awards and won 3rd prize, receiving a scholarship for further development. Her work LAZER BEAMS won the Outstanding Ensemble Performance award in Form Dance Projects' Sharp Short Dance festival and received a Hunter Seed Residency at Catapult Choreographic Hub. Eliza choreographed and performed for Justene Williams' exhibition The Curtain Breathed Deeply and performed in Opera Australia's 2019 season of Graeme Murphy's Turandot.

She received two Ausdance DAIR residencies and a March Dance Festival residency to develop her first full-length work *Old Life/ Dead Life* with Sydney Experimental Arts Ensemble with an original score by Mason Peronchik. *Old Life/ Dead Life* is being revived alongside an improvised performance for UNSW's Artweek 2019 and the ensemble has begun developing Eliza's next full-length work *Bat Lake*. Eliza is apprenticing with Catapult Dance Company for their 2020 mixed bill.

Alongside her dance practice, Eliza is studying a Bachelor of Science (Advanced) in Molecular Biology and Biochemistry and a Bachelor of Advanced Studies in Modern Hebrew

# Ella Driene

Ella Driene is a dance artist currently based in Sydney/Newcastle on secondment with Catapult Dance Choreographic Hub. She is a graduate of Ev & Bow and will be finishing up her studies at New Zealand School Of Dance by the end of this year. Whilst in New Zealand Ella performed as both a dancer and model for World of Wearable Arts in the 2018 season choreographed by Malia Johnston. This lead onto another performance in 2018 with Malia for the Armistice Day ceremony in Wellington.

More recently, Ella has collaborated with Renata Commisso on her choreographic lab through Dirty Feet. She will be joining Catapult Dance for their 2020 mixed bill.



# Nicholas Jachno

Nick attended the New Zealand School of Dance, graduating with a Diploma in Dance Performance, majoring in Contemporary. During Nick's time at the school he was involved in a remount of Hofesh Shechter's Political Mother for the 2016 graduation season. In his third year he also worked alongside Footnote Dance Company and was an understudy of 2017 rendition of Tiki Tane Mahuta.

Nick has recently come back over from Wellington after performing in Malia Johnston's, Rushes, for the 2018 New Zealand Arts Festival. Nick performed That Place In Between for Catapult

Company in 2018 in Newcastle, and will perform an excerpt of his work: An Observant Man as part of the Propel Major Event at Newcastle Art Gallery on September 27th

Mikayla Nangle is a freelance dance artist based in Sydney/Newcastle currently working with Catapult Dance Choreographic Hub under the directorship of Cadi McCarthy. Through Catapult, Mikayla has engaged with international choreographer Rachael Erdos in 'The Loneliness Project', performed site specific works with musicians and visual artists as well as develop her own solo work 'And Yet....' In 2018 she performed in 'That Place In Between' choreographed by Cadi McCarthy in partnership with The Civic Theatre Newcastle and The Arts House Wyong.

Mikayla has participated in a range of choreographic labs through Dirty Feet as well as worked collaboratively with Lisa McDonnell in 'Chamber Dances'.

Prior to this, she was a company dancer with Austinmer Dance Theatre and trained on full scholarship with Sydney Dance Company through their Pre-Professional Year. Mikayla is currently working within Catapult's new company initiative with Mixed Bill premiering in March 2020

Georgia Van Gils grew up on the Northern Beaches of Sydney committed to a very physical upbringing. In 2015, she began her

During her second year of training, Georgia was involved in Iratxe Ansa's Metamorphosis Residency in Spain; where they performed at the Bilbao Guggenheim Museum and the Teatro Victoria Eugenia.

After graduating in 2017, Georgia has performed in Rushes, created by Malia Johnston, in the NZ International Arts
Festival and a House of Sand production, 'Fear of Eggs', in the Wellington Fringe Festival. In 2019, Georgia worked with Legs on the Wall, performing in a n aerial dance work for the Sydney Innerwest Festival. During her overseas trip in Europe this year she also was a part of Sita
Osthenmier's work Îakarè performed in Berlin

Skip Willcox is an independent dance artist and founding member of the Catapult Dance Company. Through Catapult Dance Choreographic Hub, Skip has been engaged by resident and international choreographers, multidisciplinary artists and composers. She has undertaken a series of Propel residencies at Catapult Dance and a Catapult exchange residency at Critical Path, Sydney. Skip's work has been performed at the QVB Sydney, Newcastle Art Gallery, The Lock-Up Contemporary Art Space and Lake Macquarie City Art Gallery.



Previous to this, she was a company dancer at Tanzcompagnie Giessen/Stadtheater Giessen, Germany under the direction of Tarak Assam. Skip has also conducted training and workshops including the delivery of two programs of dance therapy in partnership with the University of Giessen.

To complement and extend her practice, Skip is currently studying a Bachelor of Arts majoring in Sociology and Anthropology/Politics and International elations at the University of Newcastle where she is Student Ambassador for the arts.
